RECENT CASES OF NOTE

- 3.8 million dollar verdict: An Erie County jury awarded our client \$3.8 million dollars for disabling back injuries she sustained when a weld on a Chinese manufactured piece of exercise equipment broke. We proved that the product was defective and this defect caused her injuries.
- 2.4 million dollar verdict: A jury ordered insurance companies for an Olean area doctor to compensate our client for her pain and suffering as a result of the doctor's negligence. We demonstrated that the doctor deviated from acceptable standards of medical care.
- \$600,000.00 settlement after trial: After we proved that the State of New York was responsible for our client's motorcycle accident, the State paid this \$600,000.00 settlement to our client for his severe leg fracture. We demonstrated that he lost control of his motorcycle because the State Department of Transportation had improperly filled and repaired cracks in the highway with crack-filling material.
